

Vaccines are one of the tools we have to fight the COVID-19 pandemic.

- Over 76 million doses of COVID-19 vaccine were administered in the United States from December 14, 2020, through March 1, 2021.
- Vaccines are one of the most effective tool to protect your health and prevent disease.
 Vaccines work with your body's natural defenses so your body will be ready to fight the virus, if they you are exposed (also called immunity).
- Studies have shown the COVID 19 vaccinations are safe & effective.
- Different types of vaccines are available. Most vaccines are given in two shots, one at a time and spaced apart. If you are told that you need two shots make sure that you get both.
- The vaccines may cause side effects in some people, like sore muscles, feeling tired, or mild fever. These reactions mean that the vaccine is working to help teach your body how to fight COVID-19 if you are exposed. Most side effects will not last more than a day or two.
- After you get your vaccine you will need to keep wearing a mask, wash your hands often, and social distance at least 6 feet from other people.



Year of the Monarda

Monarda is a genus that has a long history of being used as a medicinal herb. As the common name Bee Balm implies, it has also been used to soothe bee

But did you know the Oswego Indian tribe used this plant to make an herbal tea and they taught the early American settlers how to do so as well? This just happened to come in very handy following the Boston Tea Party. As the settlers revolted against the British tax on tea, they drank tea made from Monarda instead, thus thumbing their noses at the British and their tax-

Monarda is a member of the mint family and consists of multiple species, most of which are hardy perennials and all of which are native to certain regions of North America. Summertime flowering on all these species is quite attractive to humans and pollinators.

Native Americans used monarda to make bee balm tea to treat chills and fever. Monarda's three most common species are didyma, fistulosa and punctate.

Monardo is also known as Bee Balm, a member of the mint family.

Monarda is very attractive to pollinators, especially butterflies and hummingbirds.

Monarda species:

Monarda punctata, aka Horsemint or Dotted Mint, is somewhat of an unruly native prairie plant characterized by tall unbranched stems topped with rounded clusters of pink or lavender tubular flowers. The stacked combination of speckled flowers and colorful bracts make this distinctive and unusual.

Monarda fistulosa, or wild Bergamot, is one of the species commonly used for medicinal purposes. Being highly aromatic with showy lavender-pink flowers, it is

also used as a honey plant. Monarda didyma (Scarlet Bee Balm) has long been cherished for not only its use for tea but also its ornamental value. The bright scarlet/red flowers of M.

didyma are still a part of many ongoing breeding programs with Monarda. It has been a long road from these native species

of Monarda to the prized ornamental cultivars available today. Some of the first hybrids of M. didyma x M. fistulosa produced vibrant flower colors with a more well-behaved plant, but they continued to be plagued by their native attributes of being highly susceptible to mildew, somewhat tall and leggy and had a tendency to spread by rhizomes.

New varieties:

Modern breeding has introduced many new cultivars that are much more suitable in the ornamental landscape. Along with many stand-alone varieties with notable attributes of their own:

'Marshall's Delight' - Received Award of Merit from Royal Horticultural Society

'Gardenview Scarlet' - Selected by the Chicago Botanic Garden as an outstanding perennial for the Mid-

'Petite Delight' - The first of its kind dwarf introduction of Monarda at just 12-15 in. tall.

There are several newer Monarda with formidable

Monarda didyma GrandTM is an exceptionally hardy Monarda. Characterized by a profusion of bright flowers atop mid-sized plants, these also offer very good mildew resistance.

The Sugar Buzz Monardas form a solid dome of color. The 2- to 2 1/2-in. flowers top off the strong stems and deep green foliage of this series. Medium in height at around 20 in., the eight colors in this series display above-average mildew resistance and stay well contained in the garden.

BalmyTM Monardas have relatively large flowers on a fully compact plant. Balmy comes in at just 10-12 in. with exceptional mildew resistance and deep green foliage. They are dwarf and mounded, so bring new uses to the landscape.

As part of the mint family, Monarda flowers and leaves add a citrusy note to salads.

Monarda is a native of North American, mainly east of the Rocky Mountains.

Dried Monarda flowers are a great addition to any homemade potpourri. The monarda was named for Nicolas Bautista Monardes, a Spanish.

Gardening Tips:

While some Monarda species come from seed, did you know most newer selections are vegetatively propagated and are quite easy to care for in rich and organic, or just average soils?

Monarda will die back to the ground in colder climates. They can then be cut back to 1-2 in. stems. It's also a good idea to remove dead leaves and stems from the area, especially if mildew has been observed on the foliage.

As Monarda emerges from the roots/rhizomes in the spring they may be pinched to create a bushier habit

Poland Science Fair judging takes place virtually

This year's Poland Central School District Science Fair was unlike any of the district's previous 32 science fairs.

Fifty students in grades 7-11 made Google Sites for their projects with video presentations, and 24 judges from three continents signed up to review the projects online. Students with some of the top projects also gave virtual presentations to a panel of five judges.

"It has gone well," Poland said science

teacher Kevin Ford. Ford and Poland science teacher Jessica Meyer serve as 2020-2021 Science Fair coordinators. "It's a different experience for the kids, for the teachers and for the judges."

The winners of the 33rd annual Poland science fair will be announced this week with a virtual presentation. Trophies and more than \$3,000 in prizes will be awarded. Students who win awards will be eligible to advance to the Utica College

Regional Science Fair.

For this year's science fair, judges received links to students' online presentations instead of visiting students' presentations in person. Judges had about 10 days to review an assigned group of projects. The judging determined the category award winners and was used to help determine the special category award winners.

A panel of five judges conducted virtual interviews with some science fair participants on March Structural Engineering 10. The judges were:

Students sat in front of a large screen and camera in a room at school and presented their projects to the judges virtually. Then judges asked the students questions.

Eighth-grader Maddison Haver told judges about her project that compared taproots and

fibrous roots by pouring water into samples of each type of root she gathered in soil.

"The goal was to figure out which type of root has a bigger effect on erosion," she said.

Freshman Frank Sudakow explained to judges his project measuring the amount of electrolytes in Gatorade, Bodyarmor, Bolt 24, orange juice and

tap water. Bodyarmor not only had the most electrolytes, but it also tasted the best, he said.

"The real world application I could think of for this is which one people could use to replenish their electrolytes the most after a hard day of work," he said.

Sophomore Shelbi Hagues showed judges various photos of her experiment involving testing various blenders to see which one blended the smoothest smoothies. She tested the blenders with liquid and with cookies. Judges asked her favorite part of the project and got a very logical answer.

"Probably drinking the smoothies afterward," she said.

Sophomore Sarah Zuchowski guided judges through her project of testing which out of a gel capsule, uncoated tablet or coated tablet of acetaminophen dissolved fastest in hydrochloric acid. The gel capsule won.


"The purpose of my experiment was to see which one would give you the fastest pain relief," she said.

Herkimer College installs UVGI technology

In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, Herkimer County Community College (Herkimer College) has upgraded its infrastructure to ensure the health and wellness of students, employees, and campus visitors. The project included the installation of ultra-violet germicidal irradiation (UVGI) technology in the college's heating, ventilation, and air conditioning (HVAC) system.

UVGI is a disinfection method that uses short-wavelength ultraviolet (ultraviolet C or UVC) light to kill or inactivate microorganisms by destroying nucleic acids and disrupting their DNA,

leaving them unable to perform vital cellular functions.

Herkimer College contracted with Eastern Energy Solutions, Inc. (EES), an energy contracting and consulting firm focused on increasing profitability for clients by identifying and implementing Design-Build solutions that reduce operating costs, improve the working environment and resolve power quality issues negatively effecting operational and production cost. EES has been working with UVGI technology since 2008, primarily in the hospital, dairy and laundry secAccording to EES President Bob Granger, UVGI has been around for more than 75 years, and was primarily used in the healthcare industry where microbial disinfection is a major concern. With the recent pandemic, the use of UVGI is being implemented throughout market sectors and even in the home.

UVGI lighting systems are designed to provide air purification, reduced maintenance, and increased energy efficiency within the air handling units in which they are applied. As air passes through the UV-C light spectrum/wavelength, airborne infectious pathogens that can cause respiratory sickness, disease and infection (including COVID-19) are rendered inert, in-turn providing high-level, facility-wide disinfection of the air supplied to occupied spaces.

"What Herkimer College has accomplished is outstanding. The upgrades they have made

are delivering many real advantages to all on campus," said Granger.

According to Nicholas Laino, senior vice president for administration and finance at Herkimer College, the nearly \$100,000 investment in UVGI technology was 100 percent funded by federal Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act funds granted to Herkimer College. Laino said, "First and foremost, the health and wellness of our campus community is our top priority, and we are committed to maintaining a safe environment for our students, employees, and visitors."

Added benefits to protecting the health and wellness of the campus community may include reduced absenteeism and increased employee and student performance.

Custom lighting system installed in pool area

EES also recently implemented their custom designed and fabricated lighting system in Herkimer College's indoor swimming pool area. The College needed help in implementing a new lighting system that would be energy efficient, provide higher and more uniform light levels, and be able to utilize the existing electrical system. The new aesthetically pleasing lighting system is providing targeted light levels at an energy savings of 73%. In addition to saving on energy cost, the College also was able to receive a utility rebate.

"We are extremely pleased with the innovative ideas and superior work of EES. Recent investments made to update the campus infrastructure with energy efficient solutions will have a long-term payback wellworth the initial investment, not to mention the added benefits to our community and the environment," said Laino.

Commitment to reducing energy usage

"Over the past many years, we have been very aware of our carbon footprint and have made many efforts to

reduce energy usage and greenhouse gas emissions," said Tom Stock, interim director of facilities at the College. According to Stock, about 80% of the campus lighting has been upgraded to LED lighting.

LED lamps are approximately 75% more efficient than incandescent bulbs and last 5-10 times longer. Typically, an LED will last four times longer than a CFL and 25 times longer than an incandescent source that puts out the same amount of light. Although the initial cost of conventional light sources is less than LEDs, the operational and maintenance costs of LED are significantly lower. LEDs, having a longer life, reduce maintenance and lamp replacement cost. LEDs also consume less energy; thus the overall cost of LED can be significantly lower than that of conventional lighting systems. According to EES, most applications with LEDs offer a payback period as low as one to four years. Herkimer's transition to LED is estimated to save 801,870 kilowatt-hours annually. Emissions saved from this project are equivalent to 481 trees planted or 71 cars driven per year.

Herkimer College is currently working with National Grid on a street lighting conversion project along the roadway leading to campus. Although the College does not own the lights, it does pay a monthly fee to National Grid, and therefore an upgrade to LED would

result in cost savings to the College. Additionally, the Herkimer County College Foundation, a not-for-profit corporation that owns the property on which the student housing is located, is planning a lighting upgrade on housing property.

"Herkimer College has done an excellent job at reducing their carbon footprint. Their commitment and long-term planning in regard to protecting their campus community, as well as the greater environment, and reducing costs through energy conservation serves as an excellent example for other organizations," said Granger

The most current data (2018) show 82.1% of eligible New York women are getting a screening mammography, a slight increase from the 80.3% of women in 2017. The governor's initiative is to increase screening rates by 10% over the next five years.

The mammography van spans 45-feet and is equipped with a state-of-the art 3D

digital mammogram system, private exam and dressing room and a waiting room.

Breast cancer is one of the most common cancers in women, affecting one in 8 women. It's also one of the most treatable cancers when detected early. Mammograms are the most effective screening procedure for the early signs of breast cancer.

Disinfecting garden tools can help ensure the long-term health of plants and vegetables. According to the University of Minnesota Extension, plant pathogens,

including bacteria, fungi and viruses, cause diseases that can damage and even kill plants. These pathogens can be transferred to plants and infect them through bits

of soil and plant debris
that get stuck on common gardening tools,
including shovels and
pruners. Pathogens are
microscopic and invisible
its to the naked eye, which
is why even tools that appear clean may still contain harmful substances
on their surfaces that can

Disinfecting tools at the

prove life threatening to

appropriate time, such as when the tools are being stored in autumn or before using them in spring or after using them to remove infected plants, can prevent the damage caused by invisible pathogens. Avoid using strictly bleach to disinfect garden tools, as the UME notes that bleach corrodes metal and can therefore render tools that require

sharp edges ineffective. A homemade solution that's nine parts water and one part bleach can be used to effectively clean shovels, spades and rakes. The CDC notes that isopropyl alcohol (rubbing alcohol) in concentrations of 70% or more can effectively disinfect surfaces for bacteria, fungi and viruses. Such a solution can be used to disinfect hand pruners and other small hand tools. Storebought cleaners with an active ingredient that is 0.1% alkyl dimethyl benzyl ammonium

saccharinate also can be effective when disinfecting small hand tools as well as small pots and saucers.

Kovels: Antiques and collecting

Vintage advertising signs, figures, toys, print-

ed textiles, food tins and labeled bottles are all selling at higher and higher prices. Large signs with pictures of flags, Lady Liberty, figural packages, tins, toys and almost anything with a famous company logo that is in great condition is selling over-estimate at auctions. Online bidding has made it possible to offer advertising pieces to an international market with

many bidders.

This tin black and white sign in a wooden frame was used to advertise a man who repaired phonographs and sewing machines in the early 1900s. A decorator or collector could hang this vintage sign in a living room or kitchen. The eye-catching, 30-by-21-inch sign auctioned for \$1,080 in Massachusetts at Eldred's Auctioneers.

g: I'm looking for the value of Royal Albert Old Country Roses dinnerware. I have a complete set and can't find any information about it. Can you help?

A: The Albert Works was established in Longton, Stoke-on-Trent, in 1846. The pottery was granted a Royal Warrant from Queen Victoria in 1897 and the name of the

company became Royal Albert in 1904. Old Country Roses was introduced in 1962. The company claims it's the best-selling pattern in the world. Over 150 million pieces have been sold. The pattern is still being made. A five-piece place setting, previously used, sells on online for \$40 to \$50.

g: I have a complete set of Uncle Wiggily books by Howard R. Garis. There are nine books, 10 stories in each one, copyright 1943 by John Sherman Bragg. They're in good condition. Do they have any value?

A: Howard R. Garis (1873-1962), a reporter and writer for the Newark Evening News, began writing stories about a rabbit named Uncle Wiggily Longears in January 1910. A new story was published in the newspaper every day except Sunday until 1947, when

BUYING Silver & Gold Coins 315-350-0555 Garis retired. He wrote more than 15,000 stories for the newspaper. The stories were first published in a book in 1913. Seventy-nine books of Uncle Wiggily stories were published. Garis was a prolific writer and wrote stories for several other series of books under pseudonyms. Uncle Wiggily books with 10 stories sell for about \$5 to \$10 each. The price depends on condition and how early it was published.



Are you missing the fresh greens of summer? This time of year, our options for fresh, homegrown veggies can be lim-

One great option for eating fresh greens yearround may be your local farm stand. Many local farmers use creative methods to grow a variety of leafy greens throughout the cold winter.

Another idea is to try

growing something green yourself. With only seeds, potting soil, a recycled container and a windowsill, you can grow fresh microgreens or shoots, which will add a summer-like brightness to vour meals.

What are shoots? Shoots are young seedlings that can be harvested just after the cotyledon or first true leaves have developed. They can be grown at a high density and are ready to eat within a week or two after sprouting.

You can grow many types of shoots: radish, buckwheat, peas, popcorn and nasturtium, among others. Seeds for shoots are available through seed companies or at your local garden center. Just make sure that the seeds you buy are intended for this purpose. Not all seeds or plants are edible, so do your research before starting.

First, measure out enough seeds to evenly cover the surface of your container in one laver. I use about two tablespoons of seeds for a 7- x 9-inch container. Clean, plastic 4 oz. lettuce containers work well for this. Soak your seeds for 6-24 hours in cold water, enough to keep the seeds well covered.

Next. prepare growing medium. Add moistened potting soil to the container to a depth about a fingertip below the container's edge. Strain the seeds and rinse, then lay them in an even layer on the surface of the soil.

Cover the container with a lightweight plastic tray, folded newspaper or cardboard. Place in a warm, dark place. Make sure to check the soil periodically, moisture and add water if it feels dry to the touch.

After about 3-5 days, the shoots will be a couple of inches high and will push up your lightweight cover. You can now remove the covering.

Place the container in a well-lit spot, such as a windowsill. Check daily, and water if the soil is dry to the touch. Once the shoots have leafed out (about 3-5 days later), they are ready to eat.

Using a pair of scissors, you can harvest as needed. Gently rinsing the shoots before eating will help remove any of the seed casings that might have gotten stuck on top of the shoots. Dry shoots will keep in a sealed container or bag in the refrigerator for up to a week.

After you have harvested all of the shoots, you can compost the soil and roots. However, if you leave some varieties. such as pea shoots, on the windowsill or kitchen counter, they will partially regrow and you can get a second cutting.

Some ways that my husband and I enjoy eating shoots are on salads, with eggs, as toppings on sandwiches or even sautéed.

Need more direction?
