What would you do if you had 1,416 days to live? That is the heart-breaking question the staff at Montgomery County SPCA had to ask resident Rocky recently. Rocky is a mixed breed dog that has long been a favorite of the staff and volunteers at MCSPCA during his stay, due to his energetic nature and positivity.

"This week, we received the unfortunate news that a tumor that was removed from Rocky has come back positive for cancer," said Michael Buckley, Interim Executive Director of the MCSPCA. "Rocky has been diagnosed with Keloidal Fibrosarcoma, and has been given an estimated survival time of 2-3 years. We were all shocked to hear it, but it made us work harder than ever to find the right family for this wonderful dog. He deserves a loving home for these remaining years."



Why the U.S. Ban on dog imports?

Dear Paw's Corner: I've been working for months to purchase a purebred dog located in Ukraine. Today, the transaction was put on hold by the breeder, who said that dog imports are being banned by the U.S. What is going on? -- Nadiya in NYC

Dear Nadiya: What happened is that dogs are being imported into the U.S. with rabies certificates that are fraudulent. After at least 450 imported dogs were found to have fake certificates, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention took action in June and temporarily banned the import of dogs from more than 100 countries with a high rabies risk, including Ukraine, for at least one year.

According to the CDC's official notice, in 2020 it identified a significant increase in the number of imported dogs that were denied entry into the U.S. from high-risk countries. Due to reduced flight schedules, dogs denied entry are facing longer wait times to be returned to their country of departure, leading to illness and even death.

Why did the number of fraudulent rabies certificates rise so quickly? In a word, the pandemic. During lockdown, demand for dogs (and cats) soared. Worried about the risk of animals being abandoned when their owners went back to the office, many shelters drastically raised fees and other requirements for adoption. Demand for imported dogs rose.

Unfortunately, there are no options for those who intend to purchase or adopt a dog from one of these countries. If you try to import the dog anyway, or even hand-carry it across the border, it will be denied entry and shipped back home at your expense. It's a bummer, but necessary to reduce the risk of rabies spreading in the U.S.





### Herkimer College announces new mission, vision statement as first step in developing a new strategic plan

The Herkimer County Community College board of trustees has approved new mission and vision statements for the College, as part of an ongoing strategic planning process.

The statements, which were approved by the board at its June 28 meeting, are as follows:

**Mission Statement:** Herkimer College's mission is to provide dynamic educational programs and services in an inclusive, engaging community where all learners have the opportunity to grow and succeed.

**Vision Statement:** Herkimer College will be the college of choice, delivering an innovative, transformative student experience inspired by a new generation.

The College maintains a comprehensive and ongoing process of institutional planning and assessment to maintain its own expected outcomes for excellence.

The new mission and vision statements were developed through a collaborative, inclusive process that began at the start of the Spring 2021 semester. An Institutional Effectiveness (IE) Planning Committee was responsible for creating the new statements, with input from faculty, staff and students.

The IE Planning Committee is chaired by Mary Ann Carroll, associate dean of academic affairs for assessment and institutional effectiveness, and its members represent several college stakeholder groups.

Taylor Listovitch '21, president of the Student Government Association and student trustee for the 2020-21 academic year, was also included as a committee member during the spring semester. The Committee is consulting with the Society for College and University Planning (SCUP) throughout the process.

With new mission and vision statements in place, the IE Planning Committee will begin working on the strategic plan goals, objectives and action items, with input from various stakeholder groups. The finalized plan will go before the College's board of trustees for approval by the end of the Fall 2021 semester. Once approved, the plan will be publicized and prepared for implementation during the Spring 2022 semester, for full adoption by Fall 2022.

Moving forward, the mission and vision statements, along with the strategic plan, will be reviewed and revised on a five-year cycle.

"The revised mission and vision state-

ments provide critical guiding principles for our institutional planning," said President Cathleen McColgin. "Our vision for Herkimer College is progressive, and I believe it provides us with the inspiration and adaptability for an exciting future."



### Poland graduate helps her mother's class learn mindfulness techniques

Poland Central School District fourth-grade teacher Tracy Graulich recently utilized her daughter's expertise in mindfulness techniques as a source for her and her students to learn helpful tips for staying calm and positive.

Graulich's daughter is 2008 Poland graduate Sarahbeth Graulich, who operates her own business as a lifestyle designer, holistic health coach and reiki practitioner. Tracy Graulich invited her daughter to speak to her students via video conference on June 10, near the end of the school year, because she thought it would be beneficial to the fourth-graders in case they had any concerns about going into fifth grade.

"I am amazed at how much she impacted their young minds," Tracy Graulich said. "I cannot thank her enough for those few small tricks or suggestions that she bestowed onto them."

Sarahbeth Graulich said she talked to the students about the nervousness that comes with doing something new and how to have an easier transition into the next grade level. She also taught them a couple of practices they can use to calm their nerves if or when they arise.

"I hope they came away knowing that although newness is a part of life and it may be scary, that scared feeling doesn't have to overpower them," Sarahbeth Graulich said. "They have the power to choose how they want to react to something, and they have practices to help themselves through any nerves they may feel – that even though they don't know how something is going to turn out, they can go into it with

confidence and just do their best.'

Sarahbeth Graulich said she can relate to any students who might have worries about going to their next grade level.

"I was a nervous kid, especially when it came to new things, so I completely understood where they were coming from and was happy to help," Sarahbeth Graulich said. "A lot of my coaching work actually focuses on helping people understand the power of choice because it's been instrumental in the way I calm my own nerves as an adult. So, I'm grateful to have been able to bring that teaching to these students, to help them feel less nervous about new things and give them practices that can help them through the rest of their life."

Tracy Graulich's students said the experience was helpful. Students discussed techniques they learned such as focusing on their breathing, talking to new people they meet and selecting objects as mental anchors such as their hand, a bracelet, a stress ball or a pencil. Another method Sarahbeth Graulich taught students was going to their "happy place," which can be a real or imaginary location they can envision visiting to make themselves feel good, calm, safe and happy.

"Sarah taught me how to calm down better by going to my happy place, which is where I caught my first fish when I was 4 years old," fourth-grader Bradley Hoffert said.

Fourth-grader Hailey Haver said learning about having a happy place to mentally

beneficial to her.

"This will help me by calming down when something stressful is happening," she said.


"That old fire," Doc said, "was caused by a lightning strike, Windy.




