High River Energy Center LLC, 90-Megawatt Solar Photovoltaic Generation Project, Town of Florida, New York

NOTICE OF SUBMISSION OF APPLICATION

High River Energy Center LLC ("High River" or "Applicant") is seeking authority from the New York State Board on Electric Generation Siting and the Environment (the "Siting Board") to construct a 90-megawatt ("MW") solar photovoltaic electric generating facility (the "Project") in the Town of Florida, Montgomery County, New York, under Article 10 of the New York State Public Service Law ("PSL"). Pursuant to PSL § 164 and 16 NYCRR § 1000.7, Applicant hereby provides notice that, on or about September 24, 2019, it intends to file its Application with the Siting Board for a Certificate of Environmental Compatibility and Public Need authorizing construction and operation of the Project.

The Project components will include solar photovoltaic panel arrays connected by underground collection lines that will generate electricity to be delivered into New York State's transmission system via an onsite switchyard that will be transferred to National Grid to own and operate. The Project is proposed to be constructed on land either leased or purchased from owners of private property.

The Project will safely generate enough clean, renewable electricity to power approximately 22,000 households. The Project will not emit or discharge any pollutants, and it will avoid other impacts associated with traditional fossil-fueled generating facilities, such as water usage. The Project will also contribute to New York's goal of generating 70% of all electricity consumed in the State with renewable resources by 2030, and eliminating all power-sector emissions by 2040. Further, the Project will benefit the economic growth of the local community through the creation of temporary and permanent jobs, increased tax revenues, and new payments to local farmers that will help them maintain farming operations on other properties.

Construction and operation of the Project will not result in negative impacts to health, air, or water resources. The Project is mostly located on land that is already cleared and therefore avoids disturbances to forested lands to the maximum extent practicable. All impacts resulting from construction and operation of the Project have been minimized to the maximum extent practicable.

The Applicant intends to request a Water Quality Certification ("WQC") pursuant to Section 401 of the Federal Clean Water Act. The WQC is necessary to obtain a permit from the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers.

The Application contains all the information by the proposed stipulations filed in this Article 10 proceeding. Studies and analyses as required by the proposed stipulations and Article 10 address many disciplines such as land use, noise, preliminary engineering, avians, and decommissioning. The Siting Board will determine whether the Application is compliant with the Article 10 requirements. Once it is deemed compliant, the Administrative Law Judges ("ALJs") assigned to this proceeding will schedule a public hearing and issue a notice that intervenor funds, in the amount of \$90,000, will be available for eligible parties participating in the Application phase. The ALJs will also schedule a pre-hearing conference to identify parties, award intervenor funds, identify issues for the hearing, and establish a case schedule. After the hearings, intervenors may submit briefs to the ALJs who will then issue a recommended decision, upon which the Siting Board will render its decision on whether to certify the Project and under what conditions. State law requires that the Siting Board must render a decision on the Application within 12 months of its determination that the Application is compliant with the Article 10 requirements.

Interested, eligible municipal and local parties may apply for intervenor funding to be used to pay for expenses such as administrative, attorney, and/or consultant fees. 

Whatchamacallits

Although this isn't a bonafide whatchamacallit (as hopefully everyone knows these are railroad spikes), the silver-plated one has a special story behind it.

Tomato Vinaigrette

This summer's-end salad dressing starts with a

whole tomato, which lends body and richness.

I photographed both of them for comparison purposes and I hope you've noticed that the rough one is longer than the other. That is because it was spiked into regular roadbed, on the ground. The silver one was once spiked into elevated trackage and the ties were not as thick.

The Third Avenue Elevated Line, affectionately called the "EL" (pronounced



like the letter L), ran in New York City from 1878 to 1955. Eventually totally replaced by the subway system, the Manhattan portion of the EL was closed in sections from 1950 - 1955.

This spike was a presentation gift commemorating the final Manhattan section closure on May 12, 1955 and was given at Christmas of that year to an extended family member. The giver was Max E. Buck, director of merchandising of National Broadcasting Company Inc. (NBC), which was located in the RCA building at Radio City.

The spike is engraved "A memento of the 3rd Avenue 'EL'/ WRCA and WRCA-TV New York." Part of the personal note reads "There'll never be another Christmas like this one – because the Third Avenue 'EL' will be gone forever."

Italian Sausage and Potatoes

The dynamic duo of pork sausage and peppers gets even heartier when earthy red potatoes are added. To cut out some of the fat, try this dish with turkey sausage instead.

1 pound sweet and/or hot Italian sausage, cut crosswise into thirds 1 pound small red potatoes, each cut in half

1 large (about 1 pound) onion, cut into 12 wedges 2 red and/or yellow peppers, cut lengthwise into 8 pieces

1 tablespoon olive oil

1. Heat oven to 450 F.

2. In 15 1/2-by-10 1/2-inch jellyroll pan, combine sausages, potatoes, onion, peppers, olive oil, 1/2teaspoon salt and 1/4 teaspoon black pepper; toss to coat.

3. Roast sausage mixture 30 to 35 minutes or until potatoes are fork-tender and sausages are lightly browned, stirring once halfway through roasting.

New York State Public Health Law requires that all dogs, cats and domestic ferrets shall have initial vaccinations administered against rabies no later than four months of age and stay up to date with re-vaccinations. Re-vaccinaand a booster shot every three years. It is important to have pets vaccinated in a timely manner in order for the pet to be considered protected against the virus. Pet owners should bring proof of their pet's last rabies vaccination. This helps the veterinarian determine whether the pet will receive a oneor three-year vaccination; without it your pet will receive a one-year vaccination only.

Veterinarian administration fee

is \$10 per rabies vaccine. Other vaccines will be available for additional fees.

To assure the safety of other pets and people, dogs must be leashed and cats and ferrets must be contained in a pet carrier or box when attending the rabies clinic.



Water safety -Enjoy the water but stay healthy

Montgomery County Public Health wants to raise awareness about healthy swimming behaviors, including ways to prevent recreational water illnesses (RWIs). RWIs are illnesses spread by swallowing or having contact with contaminated water in swimming pools, water parks, spas, interactive fountains, lakes, rivers, streams or oceans. Illnesses at aquatic facilities can occur in or out of the water.

Recreational Water Illnesses (RWIs)

The best way to prevent RWIs is to keep germs out of the pool in the first place. Everyone can help create healthy swimming experiences this summer by following these six healthy swimming steps: • Don't swim when you

have diarrhea. • Don't swallow pool

water. • Practice good hygiene.

Shower with soap before swimming and wash your hands after using the toilet or changing diapers.

• Take your kids on

bathroom breaks or check diapers often.

• Change diapers in a bathroom or a diaperchanging area and not at poolside.

• Wash your children thoroughly with soap and water before they go swimming.

The water at the beach, river or stream looks clean, but is it? You cannot be sure since the water can contain diseasecausing microorganisms that you cannot see but can be harmful to you. Different things, such as trash, sewage or animal waste, can pollute water. Swimming and swallowing unsafe water may result in minor illnesses such as sore throats or diarrhea, or can result in more serious illnesses. Pollution of water is common immediately after rainstorms or long periods of rainy weather

where bodies of water become overflowing and can contaminate each other.

• Avoid swimming after a heavy rain • Look for signs of pol-


lution such as murky color or evidence of floating trash and do not swim if there is evidence of this.

• Avoid getting the water you are swimming in close to or in your mouth. • Avoid eating anything that may have come in contact with the water, or water and sand toys. Microorganisms can


also lurk on lounge chairs, picnic tables and walkways that have become contaminated with the polluted water, therefore wash your hands with soap and water before eating if you have touched any of these items.
