DMV reminds New Yorkers of Nov. 3 deadline to renew expired documents

The NYS DMV recently reminded New Yorkers that there is a limited amount of time to renew their expired documents including vehicle inspections, vehicle registra-

trations and non-driver IDs. The expiration date of these documents was postponed by Executive Order during the coronavirus public health emergency, but this extension will no longer remain in effect after Nov. 3.

Driver licenses and learner permits that expired on or after March 1 were extended through Nov. 3. The DMV encourages those who need to renew a driver license to do so online.

"For those who have expired vehicle and identity documents, time is running out to bring them up to date, so I am encouraging you to act now and avoid a last-minute rush," said DMV Commissioner Mark J.F. Schroeder. "It is simple and convenient to renew your registration or non-driver ID on our website, and most inspection stations have convenient hours even on the weekends. If you aren't sure where to go, use our website to find an inspection station near you."

Find an inspection station

Certified inspection stations have been open across the state throughout the pandemic and must comply with health and safety guidelines to ensure the protection of their customers. New Yorkers can visit the DMV website at dmv.ny.gov to find a nearby inspection station.

How to renew a vehicle registration

New Yorkers can renew a registration online or by mail. The DMV website explains how to renew a registration.

To renew a vehicle registration, you'll need:

- registration (plate) number
- registration class
- the last name of the person on the registration (or business name)

- payment for registration fees

The renewal fee is provided on a customer's renewal notice. It will also display on the computer screen for those who renew online. When a customer renews online, they can download and print a temporary registration to use while they wait for the new registration documents to arrive in the mail.

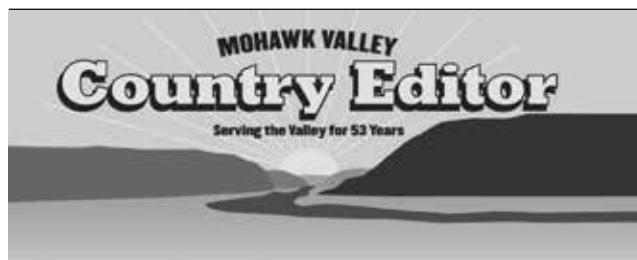

SBA and Treasury announce simpler PPP forgiveness for loans of \$50,000 or less

The U.S. Small Business Administration, in consultation with the Treasury Department recently released a simpler loan forgiveness application for Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) loans of \$50,000 or less. This action streamlines the PPP forgiveness process to provide financial and administrative relief to America's smallest businesses while also ensuring sound stewardship of taxpayer dollars.

"The PPP has provided 5.2 million loans worth \$525 billion to American small businesses, providing critical economic relief and supporting more than 51 million jobs," said Secretary Steven T. Mnuchin. "Today's action streamlines the forgiveness process for PPP borrowers with loans of \$50,000 or less and thousands of PPP lenders who worked around the clock to process loans quickly," he continued. "We are committed to making the PPP forgiveness process as simple as possible while

also protecting against fraud and misuse of funds. We continue to favor additional legislation to further simplify the forgiveness process."

"Nothing will stop the Trump Administration from supporting great American businesses and our great American workers. The Paycheck Protection Program has been an overwhelming success and served as a historic lifeline to America's hurting small businesses and tens of millions of workers. The new form introduced today demonstrates our relentless commitment to using every tool in our tool belt to help small businesses and the banks that have participated in this program," said Administrator Jovita Carranza. 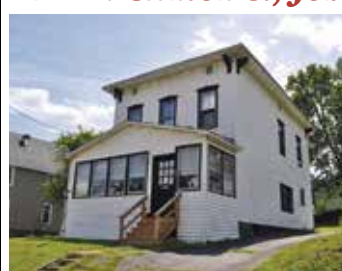

DMV encourages New Yorkers to renew expired documents as extension nears the end

The New York State DMV urges New Yorkers to renew their expired documents as the extension on vehicle registrations and non-driver IDs nears the end. Vehicle registrations including temporary auto dealer registrations and non-driver identification cards that expired in March or after will no longer remain valid after Nov. 3. New Yorkers can easily renew their registrations and non-driver IDs on the DMV website – dmv.ny.gov.

Driver licenses, permits and vehicle inspections that expired during the coronavirus pandemic have been extended at least through Nov. 3. The DMV encourages those who need to renew a driver license to do so online, and vehicle owners should get their vehicles inspected if they are past due. Inspection stations have been open throughout the pandemic and must comply with health and safety guidelines to ensure the protection of their customers.

"The state took extraordinary steps to protect the health and safety of the public during the height of the COVID-19 health emergency

including closing DMV offices and extending the validity of vital documents to reduce the burden on New Yorkers," said DMV Commissioner Mark J.F. Schroeder. "As the extension for non-driver IDs and vehicle registrations sunsets, I encourage those who need to renew their documents to use our website; it is fast and easy to do. Those who need to schedule a road test, renew their driver license or get their vehicle inspected should not delay."

How to renew a vehicle registration

New Yorkers can renew a registration online or by mail. The DMV website explains how to renew a registration.

To renew a vehicle registration, you need:

- Registration (plate) number
- Registration class
- Last name of the person on the registration (or business name)
- Payment for registration fees

The renewal fee is provided on a customer's renewal notice. It will also display on the screen for those who renew online. When a customer renews online, they can

download and print a temporary registration to use while they wait for the new registration documents to arrive in the mail.

How to renew a non-driver ID

New Yorkers can renew a non-driver ID online or by mail. The DMV website explains how to renew a non-driver ID and what the associated fees are.

To renew online, customers will need:

- Nine-digit DMV ID Number
- Date of birth
- Last four digits of Social Security number (SSN)
- Five-digit ZIP Code
- Email address

When a customer renews online, they can download and print a temporary ID to use while they wait for the new document to arrive in the mail.

In addition to renewing online or by mail, a limited number of in-office reservations are available for customers who must renew in person.

New Yorkers can also visit the DMV website to find out how to renew a license and to find an inspection station.

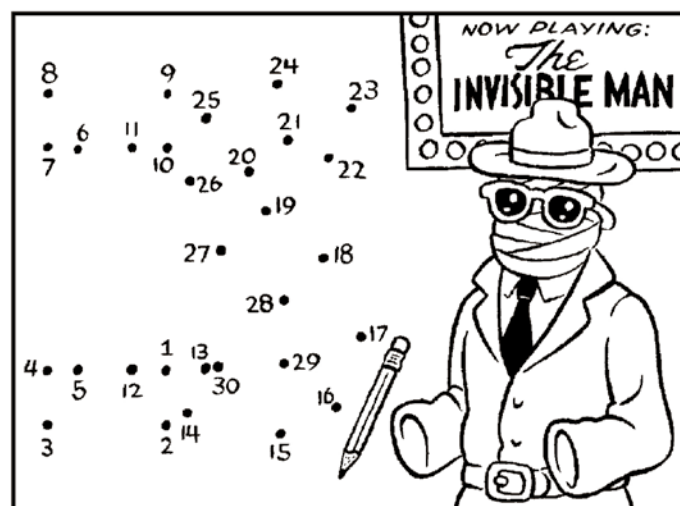

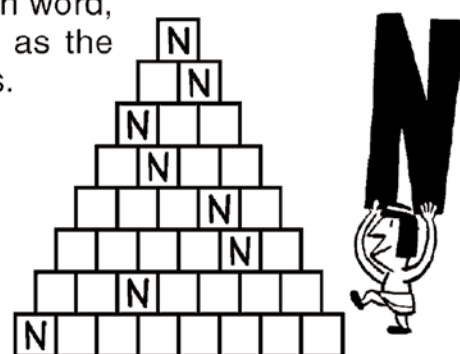

Caramel apples

These caramel apples are outrageously gooey and rich.

5 (4-inch) ice-cream-bar sticks
5 medium (about 1-3/4 pounds) Macintosh or Macoun apples

3/4 cup chopped peanuts*

1 package (14-ounce) caramels

3 (1-ounce) squares semisweet or white chocolate, melted

1. Insert an ice-cream-bar stick in stem end of each apple. Place peanuts or other topping on sheet of waxed paper.

2. Line 15 1/2-inch by 10 1/2-inch jelly-roll pan with waxed paper; spray waxed paper with nonstick cooking spray.

3. In 2-quart saucepan over low heat,

heat caramel candies and 2 tablespoons water, stirring constantly, until melted and smooth; remove saucepan from heat. Holding stick, dip 1 apple into caramel mixture, spooning mixture over apple to coat completely. (If caramel mixture in saucepan begins to harden, warm over low heat to soften.) Then, place caramel-coated apple on peanuts or other topping to coat bottom; place apple in jelly-roll pan. Repeat with remaining apples, caramel and peanuts.

4. Spoon melted chocolate into heavy-weight plastic bag. With scissors, cut off corner of bag to make a small opening. Drizzle melted chocolate over apples. Refrigerate apples 15 minutes to allow choc-

olate to set. If not eating right away, refrigerate apples, loosely covered, up to 2 days. Let apples stand at room temperature 15 minutes to soften before eating.

*Or use miniature candy-coated chocolate pieces or semisweet-chocolate pieces, flaked coconut, colored sprinkles, toffee bits or your favorite topping.

Chest CT can't replace screening mammogram

Dear Dr. Roach: I am due to have a mammogram in July, but around the same time I am supposed to have a chest CT as a follow-up to my chondrosarcoma cancer. I have a CT every other year, and an X-ray on the opposite years of both my affected arm and my lungs. Does a chest CT have the potential of showing a similar finding as a mammogram? I would just as soon not have to expose myself to so much radiation all in one month. I'm 66. There is a history of postmenopausal breast cancer in my family, in my mother's mother. — T.M.H.

Answer: A mammogram is an X-ray that is designed specifically to look for abnormalities in breast tissue. Mammograms have been extensively studied and proven to reduce mortality in women between the ages of 50-74 (outside these ages, there remains extreme controversy).

CT scans are X-rays taken from many angles and then reconstructed in a computer to provide a look at many slices of the part of the body being looked at. A CT scanner can be set to emphasize bones or soft tissue, and work is ongoing now with CT scans designed specifically for breast abnormalities. The CT scan you get as follow-up to your chondrosarcoma (a rare cancer of cartilage) is designed to look in lung tissue for abnormalities, and has not been evaluated as a means of screening for breast cancer, although I do know that some may be found anecdotally.

The CT scans you get as a part of your cancer follow-up are not an adequate substitute for ongoing mammography, which is particularly important in your case due to a family history. I do understand the concern about radiation, but a mammogram has very little radiation - approximately the same you would get from naturally occurring radiation sources in seven weeks of walking around.

Dear Dr. Roach: I read a news report that vasectomy increases risk of prostate cancer. Should men avoid this procedure

due to concern for prostate cancer? — T.S.V.

Answer: Several studies have looked at this possibility, and the results are conflicting. A 2014 study of about 50,000 U.S. men showed an increase of about 15% in the risk of fatal prostate cancer, but a 2016 study of 360,000 U.S. men showed no increase in risk. In June 2019, a study of over 2 million Danish men showed a 15% increase in overall prostate cancer risk. To put the risk in perspective, about 500 men would need to have a vasectomy for one additional man to get prostate cancer, in the Danish study. It is not clear that the vasectomy caused the prostate cancer.

It is possible that there is something about men who choose vasectomy that puts them at higher

risk to begin with; however, the authors were unable to find a known risk factor to support that possibility.

Even if vasectomy does lead to an increased risk of prostate cancer, it still has similar or lower overall risk than other forms of birth control, and is a good choice for a man who is absolutely sure he does not want to father any more children, as a vasectomy should be considered permanent. Attempting reversal is possible, but there is no guarantee of success.

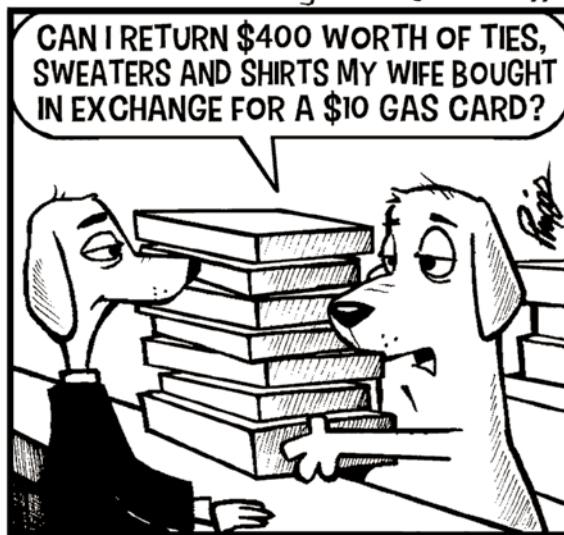

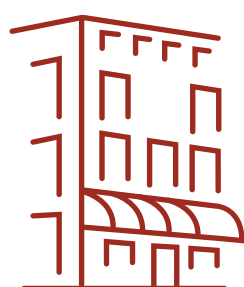
