# St. Johnsville landmark gets facelift

The 1954 Fowler Grandstand, long a focal point in this sports-minded village of St. Johnsville, is receiving a much-needed facelift thanks to the Friends of St. Johnsville (FOSTJ). To date, the three-year-old public charity corporation has raised over \$20,000 in donations for the project.

Larry Schoff, chair of the FOSTJ Fowler Grandstand Committee, explained the scope of the work. "Working with Village Mayor Charles Straney, the Friends have hired TW Services to power wash and spray paint the purlins and carrying beams of the Fowler Grandstand roof. Two online surveys conducted earlier in the year revealed that the community wanted to see the grandstand restored and determined the new color scheme. We are using Benjamin Moore Greenfield Pumpkin and Bryant Gold, purchased from Ft. Plain True Value Hardware," Schoff said.

Claus Construction has replaced the leaking metal roof with a new metal roof using materials purchased from C.H. Burkdorf Building Supplies. The cost of all work to date is \$16,760.

While celebrating the rich baseball heritage of St. Johnsville, the Friends quickly realized that "Play ball!" has been replaced by PlayStation in 2021 and the only way to keep the grandstand viable is to turn it into a multi-use venue. The COVID pandemic may have already ushered in a new reality for the grandstand, which hosted graduation ceremonies in 2020 and 2021 and a recital by students of the Joy of Dance Studio on Park Place.

The hope is that the alterations to the grandstand will enhance its desirability as a non-sports venue, according to FOSTJ President Robert Smith "Replacing the old, rusty backstop fencing in front of the bleachers with movable netting would allow for an unobstructed view from the grandstand into the infield and vice versa," observed Smith. "One might have a concert where the performers sit in the grandstand and the audience sits in the infield."

Straney expressed pride in the work being done on the grandstand. "I am thrilled to see the actions taken by the Friends of St. Johnsville to make manifest the desire of village residents to honor their past while stepping boldly into the future," he stated.

This multi-year project will continue in the spring when the Friends paint the remainder of the grandstand and structural repairs are made. "This is a community-building project and we encourage anyone interested in making this gem shine again to get involved when we schedule work days and programs in the spring," noted Smith.
