

# Keep Mohawk Valley Beautiful to double down on cleanup effort

It's not too late to join in on the Keep Mohawk Valley Beautiful Great American Cleanup. The six-county event kicked off on April 23 and will run until June 20. Teams are encouraged to register their cleanup ahead of time at

"We have had an amazing turnout across the regions this year," said Samantha Brown, recycling coordinator for the Oneida-Herkimer Solid Waste Authority. "Collectively, volunteer sign-ups have increased almost 800% from 2021. Over 1,500 volunteers have picked up over 1,800 bags of litter and collected over 200 bags of recyclables in the Mohawk Valley so far."

By registering your event on the OHSWA website, you are eligible to receive free materials including gloves, trash bags and other assistance. In addition to free materials and resources, registrants will be highlighted for their efforts on the Authority website and KMVB social media platforms.






# Central Valley Academy names valedictorian and salutatorian

#### **Weather Awareness Summer**

The National Weather Service recommends that every state promote a Severe Weather Awareness week every year. You can find the dates for this year's Severe Weather Awareness dates at weather.gov/safety/events\_calendar.

But in recent years, the volatility of weather systems begs me to suggest that Severe Weather Awareness is something we should be considering every day of every season. Since we are fast approaching a busy summer, and whether you are staying at home or traveling this summer, here are some tips for creating a weather preparedness plan.

• Know where you can get weather alerts. In addition to receiving your local weather news on TV and radio, be sure to confirm that your cell phone can receive wireless emergency alerts, and then sign up to receive text and/or email alerts from your local jurisdiction. You may also wish to purchase a

battery-operated weather radio.

- Know what the alerts mean and what action you should take. A warning means that conditions are favorable for the possibility of a weather event and to stay tuned to your information source for further details. A watch means that the weather event is imminent and that you should take cover or other-directed options. Depending on where you live you might receive watches or warnings for thunderstorms, tornadoes, flash flooding, flooding, river flooding, excessive heat and tropical storms. An extensive list of watch and warning definitions can be found at weather.gov/lwx/WarningsDefined.
- Know what your shelter plan is. Know where the safest place in your home is for your family to meet should there be a severe weather warning. Know where you and your family members should go if they are out in the neighborhood or away from home. Be sure to plan where to meet after the event is over.
  - Plan and practice an evacuation

route so that everyone knows how and where to end up.

- Identify a communications plan. During severe weather, cell phone towers are often limited, and texting may work when calling does not. When severe weather is a possibility, be sure your cell phones are well charged. Be sure every phone in your family has emergency phone numbers identified on them that include emergency services, medical providers, veterinarians, insurance companies and other services. Be sure to include a family member or friend that lives out of state.
- Prepare an emergency preparedness kit. Be sure to include water, charged cell phone charger, flashlights with fresh batteries, a first aid kit, a whistle, moist towelettes, wrench or pliers, a battery-powered or hand-crank radio and food. See more at ready.gov/kit. Keep your emergency preparedness kit well stocked and updated every year.

## Creative Outpost launches outcome-driven workshops

Inc., a nonprofit in Upstate New York, recently announced the launch of their workforce development initiative to tackle regional unemployment among young people and adults in career transition.

According to David E. Warner, founder and chair of Creative Outpost, "The organization was inspired by a handful of industry professionals with first-hand knowledge of the opportunities and skills required for high-demand content creation and post-production jobs." According to Warner, there is growing interest in filmmaking, video production and content creation in Upstate New York locations

such as Albany, Syracuse, the Adirondacks and even in Warner's hometown of Little Falls. This was the catalyst for his vision of creating a post-production ecosystem of skilled talent trained by industry leaders working in film, video, podcasting, journalism and media.

U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics shows a 21% increase in the job outlook from 2020-2030 in the content development industries, amounting to 28,600 new jobs. This is much faster than the average for all occupations. While a degree is always an asset, there are many non-degreed positions also available.

About 18,000 openings for broadcast, sound and

video technicians are projected each year. The 2021 national median pay was \$23.58/hour (or \$49,050/ year). New York has among the highest employment for audio and video technicians with employment at 4,910 (second to California at 8,930) with an hourly wage of \$31.16 or \$64,800 (higher than California at \$30.24/hour or \$62,890 annually).

Warner expects the first rollout of the workshop series to begin in July of this year, focusing on photography, film and an introduction to filmmaking created using

a smartphone. Instruction is hands-on, task-oriented and delivered in person by leading industry professionals. Follow-up online course modules are also planned so that students can continue to build upon their in-person workshops.

Creative Outpost objectives are clear: To inspire individuals to consider a career pathway in content development through technical knowledge and real-world job skills, to provide skilled interns to the film/video industries working in the Upstate region and to create a content development hub in Little Falls that allows graduates to secure gainful employment locally without the need to relocate to a large city or out-of-state.







## There's no need to squabble

t may seem out of season for those who only associate turkeys with the colder season holidays, but June is Turkey Lovers Month. It's a great time to celebrate these large domestic fowl because this is the time farmers and caretakers put in the good work to ensure your Thanksgiving is both healthy and tasty.

Like a lot of other gifts we gave to Europe, the turkey is native to North America, Spanish traders first introduced turkeys to the Continent in the 1500s. There are two species, the wild turkey of eastern and central North America, and the ocellated turkey of Mexico. The males of both species can easily be identified by their fleshy wattle, called a snood, which hangs down from the tops of their beaks. Like many other ground-feeding birds, the males are much bigger and more colorful than females (just like peacocks).

As far as we can tell, people have been eating turkeys since about 800 BCE. The earliest turkeys evolved over 20 million

years ago and they share an ancestor with grouse, pheasants and other similar birds. The wild turkey is actually the ancestor of the domestic turkey, which was domesticated about 2,000 years ago. They went the opposite direction of most livestock. And it shows:

Turkeys have been known to be aggressive toward humans and pets in residential areas. Wild turkeys have a social structure and pecking order and may respond to humans and animals as they do other turkeys. They may attempt to dominate or attack people that the birds view as subordinates.

How do we deal with this? Well, in 2017, the town of Brookline, MA, recommended a controversial approach when confronted with wild turkeys. Besides taking a step forward to intimidate the birds, officials also suggested "making noise (clanging pots or other objects together); popping open an umbrella; shouting and waving your arms; squirting them with a hose; allowing your leashed

dog to bark at them; and forcefully fending them off with a broom." This advice was quickly rescinded and replaced with a more simple warning: "being aggressive toward wild turkeys is not recommended by state wildlife officials." (As someone who has been attacked by turkeys while waiting for the school bus, I also endorse the "just stay away" rule.)

But wild turkeys are for hunting. What if you want to raise some yourself? According to the National Turkey Federation, broad-breasted white is the most commonly domesticated breed of turkey. They can be raised in a similar fashion to chickens. Just make sure they have pasture, water and food; use moveable roosts so they can be moved safely; provide lots of space; and make sure they have good access to clean air. Do not raise them with chickens, though; that pecking order could result in some serious fighting.


Today's domesticated turkeys also have








